


Figure 1. Artist Leonardo da Vinci, *The Last Supper*, 1495-1498, Source: Convent of Santa Maria delle Grazie, Milan Italy.




Figure 2. Artist, Nikki Mariner, painting, Comfort Creature, 2023, Source: Manamea Art Gallery, Samoa.




Figure 3. Artist Veronica Winters, *Positive Negative Spaces*




Figure 8. Artist, Vincent van Gogh, *Bedroom in Arles*, 1888, Source: van Gogh Museum, Amsterdam Museum.






Figure 15. Source: Father Ott Meyer, Lapita Motifs, 1910




Figure 16. Artist, unidentified pot with Lapita designs – Source: Leulumoega Museum, Photograph: Dr. Vanya Taule'alo.
